The management has planned to install Smart class room for the training of B.Ed students.

Efforts are taken to enhance the number of faculties in the emerging, multidisciplinary teaching/ research area, to hone the skills of administrative staff; planning to increase the number of job oriented and entrepreneurship programmes.

To conserve energy,

- i) All the incandescent bulbs are changed to low watt compact fluorescent lamps
- ii) All the mercury and sodium vapor (250 & 125w) street lights are changed to Light Emitting Diodes sets.
- iii) All the regular 40w fluorescent tube lights with Copper and Aluminium chokes are replaced to 32w slim tubes with electronic ballasts.
- iv) The faculty members, administrative staff and students are sensitized to use electric power judiciously.
