The following are the eco-friendly initiatives taken by the College towards a Green and Sustainable Campus.

I. Energy conservation:

To conserve energy,

- i) All the incandescent bulbs are changed to low watt compact fluorescent lamps
- ii) All the mercury and sodium vapour (250 & 125w) street lights are changed to Light Emitting Diodes sets.
- iii) All the regular 40w fluorescent tube lights with Copper and Aluminium chokes are replaced to 32w slim tubes with electronic ballasts.
